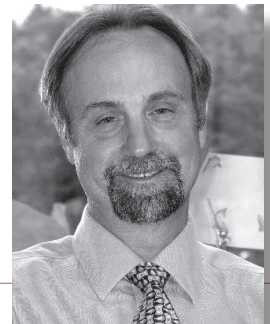

OUR PROGRAMS



SullivanArc's programs provide support and services to approximately 800 individuals with developmental and/or intellectual disabilities throughout Sullivan County, NY. Our programs reach into every aspect of the lives of our consumers in keeping with our mission statement. We enable consumers to live throughout the community in homes and group residences or apartments. Our consumers are able to work and earn pay through our vocational services and Sullivan Industries. Our free standing clinic, with up-to-date technology and skilled personnel, provides a variety of clinical and therapeutic services. SullivanArc offers an assortment of support to families of children and adults with disabilities and SullivanArc offers a variety of recreational activities, instructional classes and cultural exploration in the arts which enable our consumers to live rich, productive lives.

RESIDENTIAL and FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

The SullivanArc Residential Department of SullivanArc currently operates a variety of residential alternatives, serving approximately 150 people, each being integrated within a community in Sullivan County. Residential Service is guided by our mission statement and our philosophy is that people develop best from a secure base of interpersonal relationships; that all people have the ability to learn; that each person is unique; and, that people have the desire to be competent.

The Family Support Services Program continues to support families with a developmental disabled family member living at home. The program provides Respite, Respite Reimbursement, Waiver Residential Habilitation and Day Hab, as well as goods and services and supported over 100 families at home during 2008.

2008 Accomplishments

- Purchase of new home for relocation of the Livingston Manor house.
- Revised Personal Allowance Policy to meet new state requirements.
- Successful implementation and use of Therap Services.
- Complete relocation of supportive apartments.
- Worked closely with License Psychologist to provide training in behavior strategy and Behavior Plan creation.
- Implemented system for greater accountability performance and documentation.

2009 Goals/Objectives

- The completion of house renovation and relocation of the Livingston Manor IRA.
- Continue to work with a commitment to quality of care always placed front and center.
- Continue work with AED of Nursing to revise Medication Error policy to reflect revised processes.
- Greater effort placed on staff training.
- Complete conversion of at-home res hab workers from independent contractors to agency employees.

SERVICE COORDINATION

The Medicaid Service Coordination (MSC) department assists persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities to access supports and services based on their needs and valued outcomes. MSC services are provided by qualified service coordinators and use a person-centered planning process in developing, implementing and maintaining an Individualized Service Plan (ISP) for these individuals. MSC promotes individual choice, individualized services and supports, self-determination and consumer satisfaction. The focus of MSC is on assisting each person to achieve his or her unique goals and desires in terms of having a home, a job, a circle of friends, enjoyable leisure activities, and access to medical and clinical services.

2008 Accomplishments

- The department provided advocacy and service coordination activities for 238 persons. The majority of those live in a SullivanArc Residence, but we also served consumers from Crystal Run Village and New Hope Community.
- a State-Operated IRA and community members either living with family or independently.
- The MSC department staff continued to attend training specialized to caseload specific needs in order to continue to maintain high standards and carry out best practices in the field.
- Increased overall department caseload and assisted consumers in realizing some of their dreams and desires.

2009 Goals/Objectives

- Increase number of individuals being served.
- Ensure that Individualized Service Plans (ISPs) are reflective of the person's choice and desires.
- The Intake Coordinator will develop marketing strategies in order to educate the community about SullivanArc and Service Coordination services.

OUR PROGRAMS



CLINIC SERVICES

The SullivanArc Article 16 Clinic provides comprehensive clinical services to individuals with developmental disabilities in Sullivan and Orange counties. The SullivanArc clinic opened in 1980 as a small treatment program with limited staffing serving thirteen consumers. In 2008 we served over 700 persons with over 22,000 clinic visits.

SullivanArc Clinic services are provided to individuals who reside in our own residences, New Hope Community, Crystal Run Village, DDSO Family Care, Orange County residents and private families. Services are offered in the following areas: Audiology, Dental, Nutrition, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Podiatry, Psychiatry, Psychology, Rehabilitation Counseling, Social Work and Speech-Language Pathology. Services are available at our main site in Monticello, at 162 East Broadway as well as at our other satellite sites. All of our clinicians have had specialized training in the mental retardation/developmental disabilities field, and are monitored by the Medical Director.

2008 Accomplishments

- Expanded our knowledge of Medicare of clinical services.
- Contracted with a consulting firm to improve Clinical services.
- Clinical staff began using billing software.
- Clinical program developed tracking system to monitor services.

2009 Goals/Objectives

- Obtain positive survey of Clinic from Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities(OMR/DD).

Clinic cont.

- Secure rate increase for Clinical services from New York State(OMR/DD).
- Develop transition plan for new funding methodology.
- Obtain third party insurance approval.
- Monitor budget to ensure no loss for 2009.

DAY SERVICES

Day Services continues to serve 460 individuals in 7 Day Habilitation programs, 2 Pre-vocational programs and 1 POS program. Our individuals participate in many community activities per week including over 20 volunteer activities. The Creative Arts department provides programming enrichment to all sites.

2008 Accomplishments

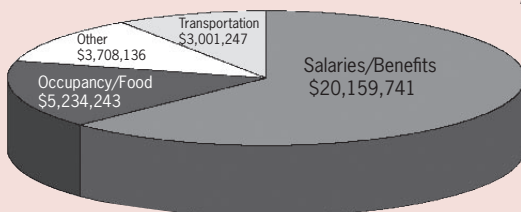

2009 Goals/Objectives

- Relocate our Senior Program to 162 East Broadway.
- Combine Pre-Vocational Programs to one cost center and under one supervisor.
- Create a new service model for Day Habilitation which is without walls.
- Creative Arts team, as well as Program Management, will be holding a variety of classes that individuals can sign up for every twelve weeks.

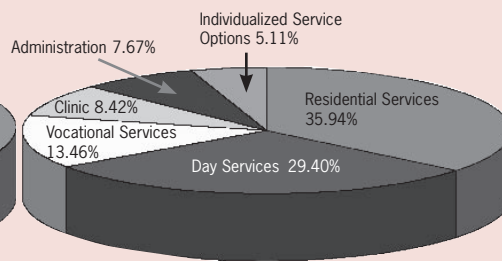
FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT 2008

EXPENDITURES



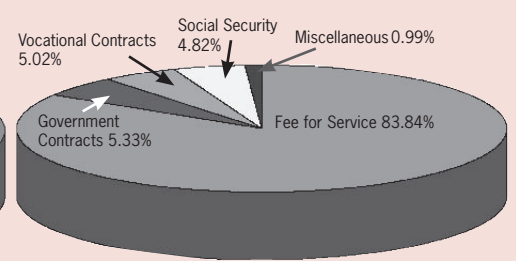
Total \$32,103,367

OUR PROGRAMS



NURSING

The Department of Nursing Services of SullivanArc is composed of an Assistant Executive Director, Registered Professional Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, and a Medical Secretary. The Department is directed towards assisting consumers to achieve the highest possible level of independence with an understanding that without optimum health, these goals cannot be accomplished. Nurses focus primarily on interventions that maximize the psychosocial, physical, affective, cognitive and developmental strengths of the persons, families, staff, and significant others, and those who deliver services.

2008 Accomplishments

- The Department of Nursing Services was a new department to SullivanArc in 2008 (Day Services and Residential Services were combined into one department). The Department's structure was created and all job descriptions and critical tasks were revised.
- Expectations and standards for Nursing Department staff members were instituted.
- A leaning needs assessment was distributed and an educational plan developed relative to staff needs.
- Review/revision of Medical Policies and Procedures was initiated. This will be an ongoing project.
- Initial steps were taken to develop a Performance Improvement Plan.
- A process was developed for handling over-the-counter medications and supplies.
- Consistency in documentation.

2009 Goals/Objectives

- Establish SullivanArc as a clinical site for the Sullivan County Community College RN Program and BOCES LPN program.
- Formation of a Performance Improvement Team
- Work with AED of Residential Services to revise Medication Error policy to reflect revised processes.
- Set up program entitled "Walking in My Shoes" for Residential Nursing staff members to experience the work of Day Program staff members.
- Create templates for Consumer Nursing Care Plans
- Implement agency-specific "National Patient Safety Goals".

VOCATIONAL SERVICES

Vocational Services consists of **Sullivan Industries**, a sheltered work center where individuals get paid for hand assembly, warehousing, and material handling work, and **Employment Services**, a program that assists people to find work in a variety of settings in the community, trains them, and provides on going supports during the duration of their employment.

The goal is to assist in allowing the trainees to earn the best possible wage given their specific disability as well as provide a real world environment in the hope that progression to outside jobs in the community can be realized.

2008 Accomplishments

- The production department reached a total sales figure of \$1,229,720 to include our Sub and Prime products
- A new Sub Contract customer, Newport Sales which supplies Loreal and Maybelline product for blister packaging exceeded the projected first years billing by \$100,000; from \$114,000 to \$214,208.
- The usage of our current Prime products has expanded to include New York City allowing us to increase sales.
- Employment Services (ES) was awarded a new UCS 5 year contract with VESID.
- ES acquired four new service contracts, one of whom was the Villa Roma.
- Enclave sales reached \$225,146, the highest in Employment Services history, which is an increase of \$44,143 from last year.
- The Work Study Program worked with four students.

2009 Goals/Objectives

- Focus on expanding NYSID contracts.
- Request an increase in the number of pre-vocational units in the sheltered workshop.
- Generate six new service contracts for Supported Employment.
- Continue to provide work to other workshops while assessing the potential of increasing the volume to some, which will allow for a reduction in total shops used.
- Combine the two prevocational day service programs with that of Sullivan Industries to form one prevocational program (instead of three), under one Director.
- Place 30 consumers in supported employment in the community and 20 individuals in performance based placements.

SullivanArc received grants in the spring of 2009 for the purpose of advance training for staff. The grants, totalling \$25,000 came from The Key Bank Foundation and an Aileen Gunther member-item grant. Training will take place in partnership with Sullivan County Community College and will implement strategies designed to expand and develop the management and leadership skills of supervisory personnel.
